My Dear Friends:

I am writing this letter aboard a plane for San Francisco where I will spend six weeks studying theology as part of the continuing education program for Maryknoll Missionaries. One of my five courses indicates our concern for relevance in the constantly changing world . . . "Social Problems and Modern Theology". People in government, business and education are perpetually "updating" their personnel lest they think the old systems, however, perfectly good in their day, will combat the present problems.

Honestly, I have thought of you collectively and personally as tensions and crises increase daily. And yet I surmise that common sense, a sense of humor, and a hope in the future are still the prevalent characteristics of the St. Francis parishioners.

Last night I read "Revolution of Hope" by Erich Fromm and I can't be impressed with the simple truth that we, and only we, can humanize our growing technological world. The need for Christian values and deep concern over the world and local issues is the Christian dimension we can bring to the solution of them.

With pride we rejoice in the fact that all the Latin American bishops in a remarkable document have put priorities on the 2 areas where we in Huehuetenango have been pioneering the past year. It includes the formation of small Christian communities and the further training and deepening of community leaders.

Now the task remains before us to do these things effectively. Our time may be limited but we know that we can fulfill this mission through a pastoral institute which will capacitate 120 local leaders in basic and special education, leadership, human awareness, the whole Christian message revolving around Man, Christ, and Community and other well planned materials that will result in the formation of young, responsible, Christian communities. Three young girls from the Maryknoll Teacher School have volunteered a year's service "gratis" and we are confident of more in this all encompassing project. That's our latest news and as always a further step towards reaching the impossible dream.

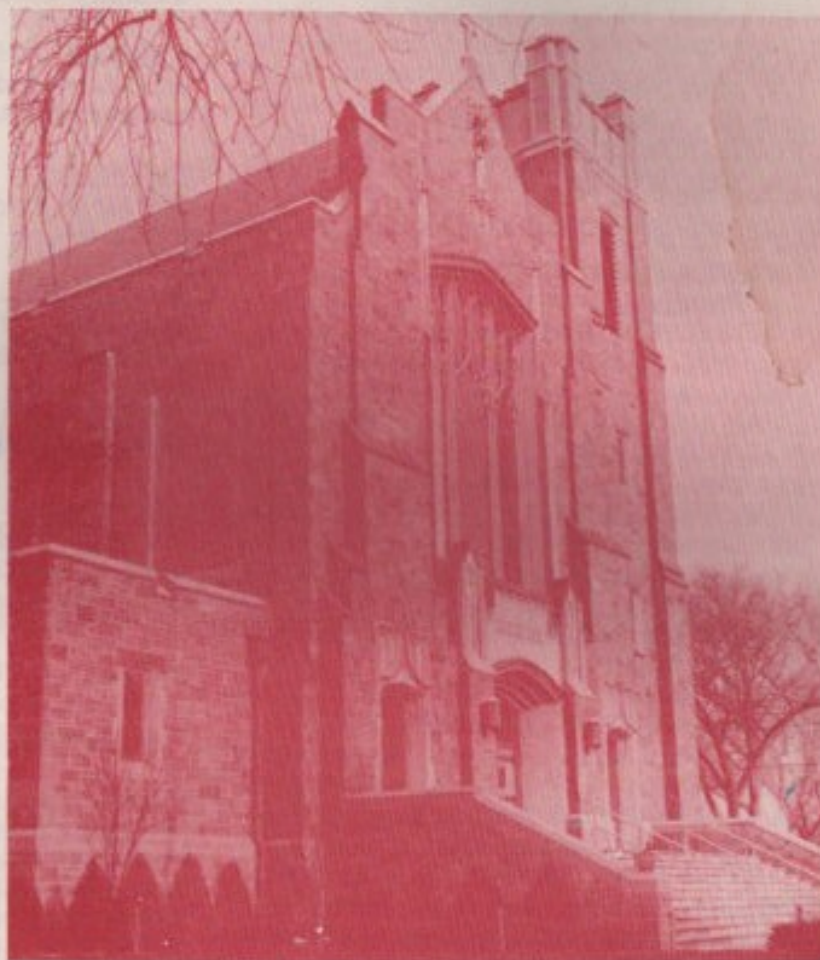

OBJECTIONABLE MAIL ADVERTISEMENTS

A family receiving a pandering advertisement, (according to the U.S. Post Office Department, Washington, D.C.) and finds it offensive, has authority under a new Federal law to ask that its members receive no more mail of any kind from the sender. An advertisement is considered pandering if it offers to sell material which is, **IN THE OPINION OF THE RECIPIENT**, "erotically arousing or sexually provocative." The material can be in the form of a display, classified, or editorial-style advertisement.

The individual mail patron is the sole judge of whether an advertisement is offensive to him. If you or your family finds the material offered is of a pandering nature, complete the statement on the back page of POD Publication 123 (Rev.), obtainable from the Post Office, in asking a postmaster to curb the receipt of additional mail from the sender. Children under 19 years of age residing in your house can be listed in the request by name and age.

American families are shocked on occasion by advertisements which they find offensive or believe to be morally harmful to

their children. While in most cases the ads are not legally obscene and are therefore mailable, they are clearly unwelcome in many homes. This law gives families the right to decide they want no more mail from a firm sending out what they consider pandering advertising, but it does not deny others the right to an unrestricted flow of material which is mailable.

With the major share of the so-called pandering advertising coming from a small number of dealers, many of whom exchange mailing lists, it is believed that the patron's

request will provide substantial relief to those who do not want such material.

HOW THE LAW WORKS:

Families receiving advertising from U.S. mails which they believe is pandering can ask a postmaster to direct that the promoter send no more mail of any kind to them. The sender is also ordered to remove the family's name from any mailing lists he owns, controls or rents. If a family moves and it wishes to continue the order at the new address, it is necessary to furnish the new address to the postmaster who issued the order.

ENFORCING THE LAW:

The Post Office Department and the Department of Justice are required by the law to follow several specific steps in carrying out a family's request that it receive no more mail from a firm mailing what they believe is pandering advertising.

When the patron's request is properly submitted, the Post Office Department sends a "prohibitory order" directing the sender to refrain from any further mailing of any kind to the complaining patron. This is effective 30 days after sender's receipt of the order.

The patron must bring any violation of the order to the attention of the postmaster who issued the order, enclosing all evidentiary matter, such as the second mailing and its envelope.

If the mailer still fails to respect the order, and the Department finds that it is being violated, the Postmaster General will ask the Attorney General to apply for a Federal Court order directing compliance. Failure to observe the court's order may be punishable by a fine or imprisonment.

TO INITIATE AN ORDER

Send offensive advertisement, its envelope and signed form to postmaster with the words: "Request for prohibitory order" on the face of your envelope.

Who's a Hypocrite?

THE YOUTHFUL avant-garde, both black and white, is persuaded that feeling is where it's at, not thinking, that the soul is superior to reason. So perhaps it should surprise no one that they demand that the churches fork over a half billion dollars to black Americans, in reparation for the historical sufferings of Negroes. No discount allowed, apparently, for the big role played by the churches in abolishing chattel slavery in this country. And none of the loot to be shared with the descendants of the 300,000 or so white men who died fighting against slavery in the Civil War.

Many young rebels, black and white, disclaim any personal responsibility for what their parents did wrong, and

properly so. But their parents are to be held responsible for what *their* parents or grandparents did wrong. Nice work if you can get it.

True pacifists aside, the young militants claim they hate war and love peace. They hate this particular war in Asia, but they love their own substitute wars on campuses and elsewhere. They are in fact warriors, containing within their breasts all the hate, fear, envy, aggression and boredom out of which so many wars have been born. They assume the right to commit acts of common criminality, but demand exceptions from the common penalties.

One of the basic complaints of young revolutionaries is that adult society is full of hypocrisy. But it appears that hypocrisy is one phenomenon that has managed to bridge the generation gap.

My Dear Friends of St. Francis:

Realizing by now summer has passed and school has begun again I thought of bringing you the latest news from Huehuetenango. Down here schools close in mid-October so we're planning to employ the services of many youth in this year's "Operation Amigo". As you may recall each November and December we send teams of youth (16-21) to live and work among the poorest of the poor in our outlying villages. Before going the youth spend eight days of intense preparation, not just in academic materials but most of all in cultivating the right attitude. We want responsible and dedicated volunteers conditioned to act as brothers with these people and not as superiors. This requires much sensitivity, orientation and informal supervision on our part but we have the confidence that they will come through again. This is no small point in Guatemala because a social conscience is created, among these future agents of change in a country where 18 is the voting age. Besides that other areas in the country have copied our program.

Through your continued financial aid we hope to reach 2000 people living in misery with programs of alfabetization, vaccination and health classes, formation of cooperatives, "better homes and gardens" (they live in mud huts and the damp dirt is their floor) and all facets of community development. Three Maryknoll Sisters from the parish will live out in the hills during this time and my job will be to ride rough shod (not really) on all the centers. Despite 3 turnovers in my jeep and twice being stuck in the river, we keep moving. Right now Guatemala is a disaster area as a result of the floods and hurricane rains.

Your mission aid will be used completely also by reason of a full month's leadership training and integral education program for 40 young (16-24) "campesinos" who never had the opportunity of a formal education. These will be the indigenous leaders so necessary to bring about "the urgent, radical, and rapid changes" that Pope Paul speaks about.

Of course there are a hundred more projects underway or ready for the launching pad. We are still so far away from denting the problem of underdevelopment, but each day we see more and more people conscious of the need to change their attitudes and the unjust structures surrounding them. The united efforts of the parish team and we count upon the laity, both adult and youth, as well as all of you in St. Francis to create a "more just, peaceful and progressive society" in this corner of the world.

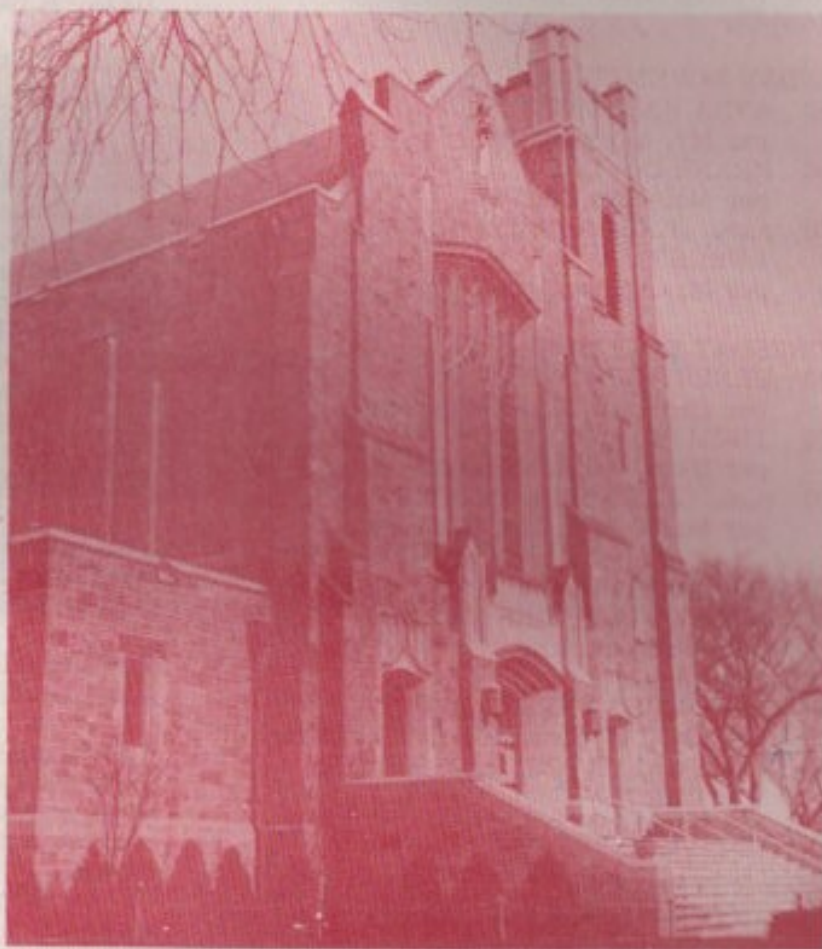

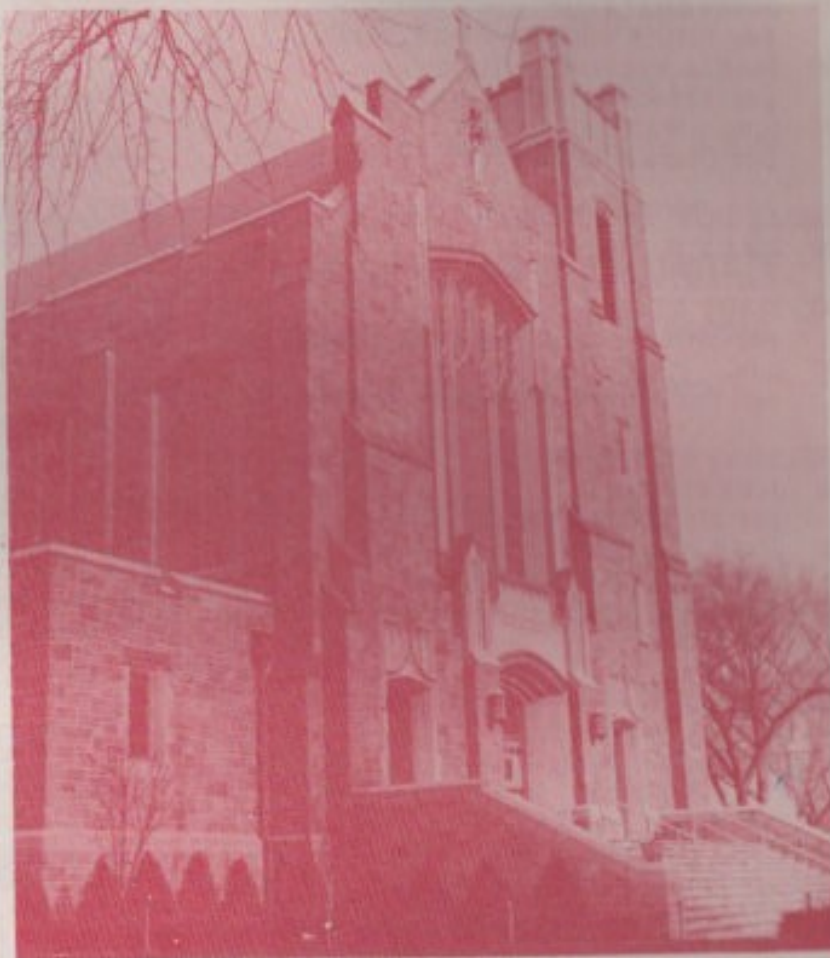

My dear friends:

I've been so busy I didn't notice that November is a 5th Sunday Month. Down in Guatemala it's school vacation time. We're so delighted that "Operation Amigo" is going so well. 65 youth between the ages of 16 and 24 are living and working with the poorest of the poor in 22 distant village centers. For six weeks they are giving classes in basic education but most of all learning to be real brothers to their fellowman. They're living out of the sleeping bags that came through the generosity of St. Francis. As a matter of fact, St. Francis is sponsoring the whole program including the 8 days of orientation we had with the youth before they went out into the villages. The estimate is that they are reaching more than 1800 people. We're proud of these youth and I'm grateful to all of you.

Undoubtedly, we take our lead from great church men like Cardinal Suenens who wrote the much publicized "Co-responsibility in the Church". I might substitute the word world for church in this case and say all of us young and old, at home and abroad must feel this co-responsibility for the underdeveloped world. Christ came to give the good news to the poor, to heal the afflicted, to announce liberty to the enslaved, to give sight to the blind (Luke 4:18). Isn't this our mission here on earth also?

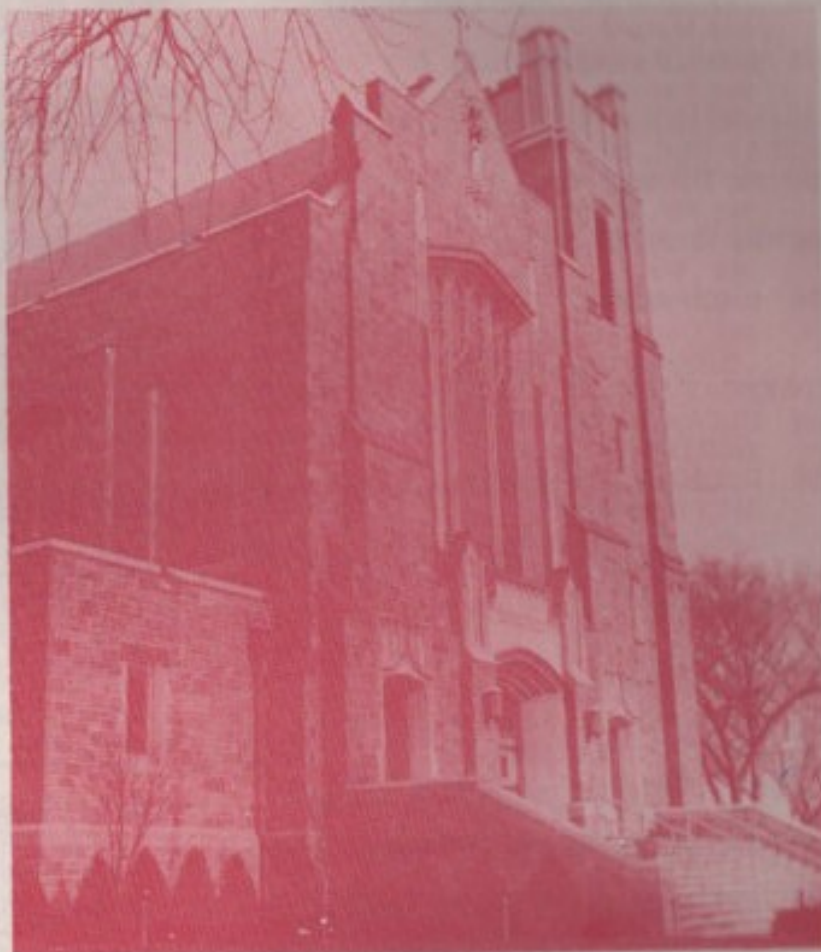



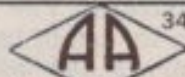
